

SEPTEMBER BOER SHOWDOWN II

The show will start at 10:00am with the junior wether show followed by the ABGA sanctioned open show.

Proceeds from the show and concessions will be used by the Goat Association to help purchase new pens and a new floor for the county fair goat barn.

1. The show will be sanctioned by the American Boer Goat Association (ABGA) and their rules shall govern. In case of discrepancy or for rules not adequately covered, the show committee's decision and/or judges decision is final.
2. Wether exhibitors must be under the age of 19 on January 1st of the current year.
3. The breeding classes will use the birth dates, as listed on the registration certificate, to determine the class divisions. The show date will be the base date for computing all ages.
4. Original registration certificates are required, though a copy of a Registration Application, stamped with the date received by one of the listed associations, can be accepted for kids less than 3 months of age.
5. All pens are to be bedded with wood chips, shavings or straw. NO BARK OR MULCH. Shavings will be available for purchase at the show.
6. All animals must be in place, and registration papers checked in with the show secretary, by 9 a.m. the day of the show. Pen availability will be on a first come basis.
7. Substitutions are allowed. If you have pre entered you may enter up to 3 goats late without late fees. No refunds. There will be a \$20.00 service charge for NSF checks.
8. All animals must be healthy. No visible signs of abscesses or other contagious diseases (pinkeye, sore mouth, ringworm etc.) will be allowed. Any unhealthy or questionable animals will be asked to leave the fairgrounds. No Refunds. The Show Chairperson and their committee reserve the right to excuse any animal of questionable health.
9. All out of state animals must have health papers (including recipient does) and proper tests needed by the Indiana State Board of Animal Health. All exhibitors should have a Premise ID and need to list it on their entry form. No health papers are required for goats originating in Indiana.
10. All goats must comply with Indiana scrapie rules. Contact the Indiana State Board of Animal Health at 317-227-0300 for more information.
11. The Huntington County Goat Association, Huntington County 4-H Fair Association and/or the City of Huntington Parks Department will not be held responsible for loss, damages or accidents. By paying for entries in the show you acknowledge that you and your family or agents participate at your own risk and that you are responsible for any loss, damage or accident caused by your goats.
12. Anyone not acting in an honorable manner will be required to leave the fairgrounds immediately, and will not be allowed to return for the remainder of the show. No Refunds.
13. The junior wether show will have class premiums that will be determined by the number of paid wether entries at the show. Other prize moneys may be available on show day.
14. ALL WETHERS ARE TO BE WEIGHED OR BE IN LINE TO BE WEIGHED BY 9:00am THE DAY OF THE SHOW. NO EXCEPTIONS. NO REFUNDS
